BEST LOCAL DINING



"Hotel Belmar has a great farm-to-table dining experience that's all organic. Its restaurant, Celajes, creates foods with local flavours like coffee and chocolate. It has a beautiful mixed-greens salad in a toasted Parmesan bowl, filled with edible flowers. Another [dish] I love is the steak with an organic coffee glaze."



MONTEVERDE MUST-DO

"You have to experience the Cloud Forest. It doesn't matter which reserve you choose, they're all non-profit. Do a nice, long hike-it's phenomenally beautiful. The gem of the cloud forest is the hiking."

FAVOURITE DAY TRIP

"There are a few hot springs in the area that aren't as touristy as the La Fortuna springs. One great spot is about a 20-minute drive outside the village in an area called La Lindora. There are two pools overlooking the river. There is a horse trail you can take, or you can hike to them."

LOCAL EVENTS

"If you ever hear about a local event, tourists are welcome. Everyone here wants to show off what we do. The community is incredibly accepting, and there's always something happeningespecially during high season. The supermarket and Pension Santa Elena have flyers of what's going on."
